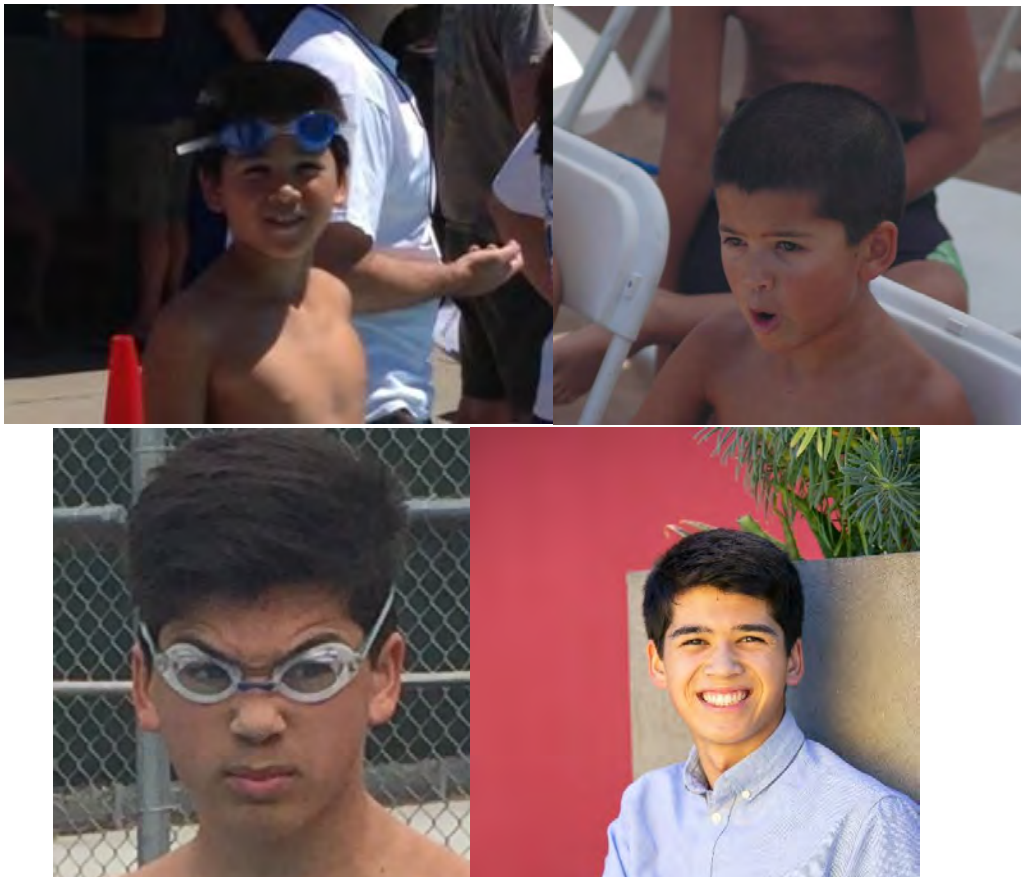

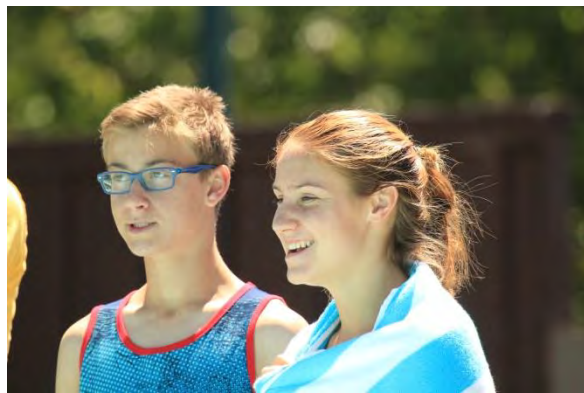

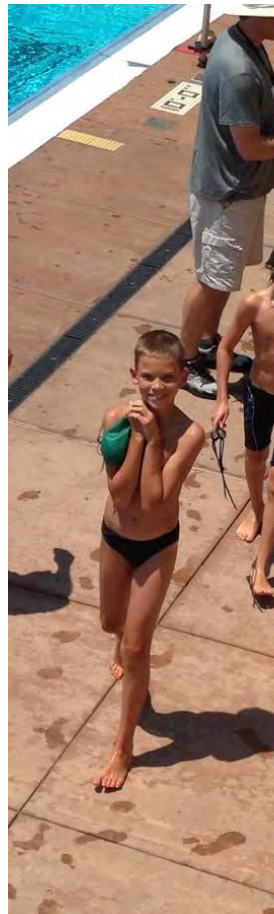
Tyler Hodson
